

4. The Fair Board will print entry tags based on information provided.
5. Plant material may be obtained from any source; however, amateur grown material is encouraged. NO potted plants in this category.
6. No artificial plant materials or artificially colored/dyed fresh plant materials are permitted. Bleached, dried, and/or preserved materials may be used. Painted material shall only be used in modern designs. Fresh or dried plant material may be used in all designs unless stated otherwise. Additional accessories and bases are permitted. Tri-fold back-drops are NOT permitted.
7. To ensure creativity, entries must be substantially different from an entry submitted in the previous year(s). If the Staging Committee recognizes an entry as significantly unchanged, it may be ruled ineligible for competition.
8. Have identification on all containers and secure small accessories. The committee will exercise due caution, but cannot assume any responsibility for loss of or damage to accessories or containers. Because of space limitations, designs are limited to no more than 30" in height and width unless otherwise specified.
9. The judge reserves the right to award all or none of the following in each class: First, Second, Third, and/or Honorable Mention. Premiums will be awarded for First and Second place entries.

CLASS 1101 – ROSES

1. HYBRID TEA ROSE, named and disbudded
2. FLORIBUNDA, POLYANTHA, or GRANDIFLORA ROSE, any named variety(one stem, do not disbud, terminal bud may be removed)
3. FULL-BLOWN HYBRID TEA ROSE
4. ROSE, ANY UNNAMED VARIETY
5. COLLECTION OF 3 ROSES, one each of a different variety of hybrid tea rose displayed in same container
6. MINIATURE ROSE, may be naturally grown or disbudded
7. SHRUB ROSE (examples: Knockout, Fairy Rose)

Class 1102-HORTICULTURAL EXHIBITS

1. TUBEROUS BEGONIA, one bloom and one leaf; leaf need not be attached (Display in dish or vase)
2. MARIGOLD, Large flowered, one bloom
3. MARIGOLD, Dwarf, one spray (Example:French marigold)
4. ZINNIA, Small flowered (under 2"), named and disbudded
5. ZINNIA, Medium flowered (2-4"), named and disbudded
6. ZINNIA, Large flowered (over 4"), named and disbudded
7. SNAPDRAGONS, Large, disbudded
8. SNAPDRAGONS, Dwarf, disbudded
9. GLADIOLUS, over 3.5", one spike, side shoots removed

10. GLADIOLUS, Small and Miniature, under 3.5", one spike, side shoots removed
11. PETUNIAS, one spray
12. DAHLIA, Large, one bloom, disbudded, over 7"
13. DAHLIA, Medium, one bloom, disbudded 3"-7"
14. DAHLIA, small, one bloom, disbudded, up to 3"
15. SUNFLOWER, flower head 6 inches or over, displayed fresh
16. SUNFLOWER, flower head under 6 inches, displayed fresh
17. RUDBECKIA or ECHINACEA - white or cream
18. RUDBECKIA or ECHINACEA – yellow or gold
19. RUDBECKIA or ECHINACEA – pink or purple
20. RUDBECKIA or ECHINACEA – any other color
21. SHASTA DAISY
22. LIATRIS
23. PERENNIAL PHLOX
24. ANY VARIETY EVERLASTING, displayed fresh (some examples: celosia, strawflower, annual or perennial statice, globe thistle,globe amaranth)
25. HOSTA, single leaf, large, leaf blade width 8" or over
26. HOSTA, single leaf, medium, leaf blade width 5" to under 8"
27. HOSTA, single leaf, small, leaf blade width 2" to under 5"
28. HOSTA, single leaf, miniature, leaf blade width under 2"
29. HOSTA, Collection of 3 different varieties, of equal size; displayed in same container
30. ORNAMENTAL GRASS, 3 specimens, same species of equal size (some examples: ornamental millet, papyrus, fountain grass, pennisetum)
31. COLEUS, one stem, bloom removed
32. ARTEMESIA, one stem
33. CALADIUM
34. BEGONIA – One stem foliage only
35. HEUCHERA/CORAL BELL
36. ORNAMENTAL FOLIAGE, ANY OTHER ANNUAL SPECIE
37. ORNAMENTAL FOLIAGE, ANY OTHER PERENNIAL SPECIE
38. ANY OTHER ANNUAL ROUND FORM (some examples: Cosmos, Calendula, Gerbera)
39. ANY OTHER PERENNIAL ROUND FORM (some examples: Carnation, Coreopsis, Geum, Painted Daisy, Stoke's Aster; must be disbudded)
40. ANY OTHER ANNUAL SPIKE FORM (some examples: Larkspur, Bells of Ireland, Cleome, Nicotiana, Salvia, Stocks, Veronica)
41. ANY OTHER PERENNIAL SPIKE FORM (some examples: Delphinium, Lupine, Hollyhock, Red Hot Poker, perennial Lobelia)
42. ANY OTHER ANNUAL SPRAY FORM (some examples: Ageratum, annual Lobelia, Sweet Alyssum)
43. ANY OTHER PERENNIAL SPRAY FORM (some examples: perennial Sweet Peas, hardy Asters, Baby's Breath, Russian Sage)
