CLASS 1103 – POTTED PLANTS
Pot or container size not to exceed
12” diameter at top of pot

1. AFRICAN VIOLET
2. BEGONIA
3. CACTUS OR SUCCULENT – one variety of plant per pot
4. COLEUS
5. FERN (must have fronds)
6. GERANIUM
7. BLOOMING
8. FOLIAGE – one variety per pot
9. MIXED POT
10. DISH GARDEN OR FAIRY GARDEN

CLASS 1104 – HANGING BASKETS
Basket size not to exceed 12” diameter

1. BLOOMING
2. FOLIAGE
3. MIXED BASKET - blooming and foliage plants; any entry in a hanging container

Class 1105 - ADULT ARTISTIC DESIGN
Due to space constraints, designs may not exceed
30” in height or width unless otherwise specified

1. Brown-Eyed Girl – using dried materials
2. Silver Wings – using silver in the design
3. Courtesy of the Red, White, and Blue – using red, white, and blue in a horizontal table centerpiece, not to exceed 24” width

4. Ebony and Ivory – using black and white in “S”-shaped design
5. White Diamonds – using white and sparkles in Stretch design
6. Purple Sky – Designer’s Choice using purple
7. Little Red Wagon - Designer’s choice using red
8. Green Garden – green monochromatic design
9. Blackbird – using black in your eclectic design
10. Fields of Gold – Using gold in a vertical design, not to exceed 36”

CLASS 1106 - JUNIOR CLASS
(ages 17 and under)
Designs may not exceed 30” in height or width
unless otherwise specified

1. Four Pink Walls – design featuring pink placed within a frame
2. Goodbye Yellow Brick Road – crescent design featuring yellow
3. Orange Crush – a traditional mass design with a round shape that includes orange flowers

TIPS FOR ENTERING SPECIMENS AND
ARTISTIC DESIGNS

- * Check specimens for bugs, insect damage, dead leaves, dirt, and pesticide before entering
- * Condition specimens by cutting at least 24 hours before the show and keeping them in water in a cool place
- * Groom specimens with a soft brush (like an artist’s brush) to remove any dust or pollen from petals or leaves
- * Disbudding should be done when the side buds are small—not on the day of the judging
- * Write the name of the variety (if known) on the entry tag (ex: Rudbeckia ‘Indian Summer’); Do NOT make up names
- * Flowers and materials for Artistic entries do not need to be home grown
- * Stay for the judging (begins at 12:00 noon) and the judges’ comments following the judging. Learn from the best to be able to improve your entries the following year. They will answer questions then about what traits they looked for in specimens and elements of design that made entries the winners.
